When should I contact an EO Ombudsperson?

- When you need someone to listen.
- If you believe that there is a possible violation of University policy and you would like advice for navigating options and available University resources.

Who are EO Ombudspersons and how are they associated with the Office of Ethics and Compliance?

EO Ombudspersons are Temple University administrators who act as liaisons for the Equal Opportunity/Civil Rights Compliance unit of the Office of Ethics and Compliance.

Do I have to go to the EO Ombudsperson from my school/college or department?

No, an EO Ombudsperson will speak to you without regard to school, college, department affiliation, or physical location.

How are EO Ombudspersons selected?

EO Ombudspersons are generally appointed each year by the provost, vice presidents, or deans.

Who are the EO Resource Persons?

EO Resource Persons represent specific areas of expertise, which enables them to provide assistance and support for EO Ombudspersons.
